FROM THE EDITOR

A Tribute to "Mr. Railroad" Paul Roy

Paul was a long time supporter of the WCRA and passed away on Sept. 15th. Paul was a friendly hardworking passionate railroader. He started working for Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR) in 1956, then worked for: Northern Alberta Railway (NAR), Pacific Great Eastern (PGE), Canadian National (CN), & BC Rail. Paul worked many positions on the railroad starting as a Section man & Foreman; Telegraph Operator, Assistant Agent, Agent, Train Dispatcher, Chief Train Dispatcher, Rules Instructor & Senior Train Supervisor at Robert's Bank. He retired after 32 years of service.

Paul was a collector of railroad memorabilia. At one time, Paul had the largest private railroadiana collection in Canada which all started with a switch key. He "worked", more like played with his railway hobby by leading/organizing work parties to construct various mini rails for various associations/clubs (with the Heritage Park mini rail a prime example); entrepreneur and founder for Western Rails, Paroni Enterprises and PDR's Train Shop; & traveler, he (& Mary) rode the rails of the world and meet other railroaders. He collected many pieces of railroad memorabilia as well as full scale locomotives and cars, for example, an Electric Locomotive #6001 donated to the Railway Forest Museum in Prince George; a private rail car named "Marjatta" dedicated after his wife & also helped fund the "Paul D Roy" car. Both rail cars are parked at the West Coast Railway Assoc. (WCRA) museum in Squamish. Paul has already donated some of his railroadiana collection to a few BC museums: Port Moody, Squamish and Prince George.

Paul and Mary focused a lot of energy organizing work parties and supervising the construction & operations of the minirail at WCRA. Their work parties always had a good volunteer turnout with Paul organizing the workers and Mary feeding them them lunch. What a team! During the off season, e.g. Christmas and Halloween, they operated the mobile minirail track with railcars for children to ride at a couple lower mainland shopping malls, parking lots & Canada Place, with all the proceeds going to WCRA. Paul funded & dedicated the "Silver Fox Station" in memory of his mother. And WCRA dedicated a Minirail Shop to Paul for "Outstanding Support and Vision of the Minirail Venture."

Paul founded and chaired the Western Rails Railroadiana Show in Burnaby. It was known as the largest Railroadiana Show in Canada. Paul chaired the show for over 20 years. The show enabled Paul and his railroad friends to display and sell their railroad treasures and Paul's network grew to include more of BC, Alberta, & Washington State.

Paul won many well deserved awards including including two WCRA Volunteer of the Year in 1995 & 1996 and being inducted into the Canadian Railway Hall of Fame in 2009.

ASSOCIATION NEWS

FROM THE SEPTEMBER GENERAL MEETING

Chair Craig McDowall called the meeting to order at 1935 hrs with 15 Voting Members

present. THIS DID NOT CONSTITUTE A QUORUM.

A Moment of Silence was held for long time Member/Supporter Paul D Roy who passed away on September 15th. Paul was a member for 28 years, actively supporting Railway Heritage in many locations in BC. A Celebration of Life, will be held in the Spring and will be by Invitation.

Bob Philip noted in his Presidents Report – Speeders donated by Carl Vanderspek have started to arrive on the property. There are plans for Bob, Robert and at least one Collection Committee Rep to meet monthly to discuss Collection matters. 6520 is still being kept under wraps - Painting is complete but the appliances still have to be reattached.

Bob Philip covered all the Staff Reports:

• Financially all indications are that we are doing better ... 2020 - Q1 will tell. Continue hopeful of Movie revenue – Still in the running for work from a Bat Girl project and possibly one for Hallmark before Xmas;

• The Board Chair and the President met with CWB at the Bank's request . The bank is happy with how the finances are being handled and with our Strategic plans. They also explored the possibility of acquiring a \$100k Letter of Credit to help us get through tight times without resorting to Member loans;

• Recent agreements permit us to use MP2 acquisition funds to build an enclosed shelter over the tracks on the east side of MP2 (old MP1 access tracks) to provide protection for 4 to 6 more cars;

• #6503 – still on static display. Awaiting electrical parts that have been ordered;

• In Fundraising, the lead donor supporting the 2860 restoration has met with both groups providing the estimates (40k - 50k). If an agreement can be reached the next step will be the boiler Assessment (incl stripping the cladding);• Still working to meet the two major Strategic Plan goals, Paying down the Debentures

& Members loans in addition to building the WCRA endowment from \$1.6M to \$5.0m; • There are plans to close the Heritage Park to the Public for January/February & March 2020 but it will still be open to Members & Volunteers to do restoration work;

• Website will be used more to communicate with the Members now Newsletter is quarterly; • Work is still underway with the rebranding designating the Heritage Park as a Museum;

• Question – Going forward how will MP2 Rent be structured? Ans - At Market rates. Food Bank ultimately relocating downtown which will put total site on an equal footing.

Other Reports:

• George Game reported the 374 Pavilion noting that with the arrival of attendance is winding down ... now averages 140 visitors/day

• Jeremy Davy confirmed that the Vancouver Train Expo 2019 will be held at the PNE Forum Nov 9 (1000 - 1800) & Nov 10 (1000 - 1700). WCRA will take MiniRail and have 3 tables supporting Association activities

• Jeremy Davy REMINDED all that the OCTOBER General Meeting will be held one week earlier – October 22nd so as not to conflict with BCSME Halloween Train preparations

• Volunteers are needed for VTEX-19 ... event staffing and set-up/takedown. Sign-up sheets available tonite & at October Meeting

• Craig McDowall updated the GENERAL MEETING SCHEDULE -there will not be a General Meeting in December 2019. Starting in January 2020, meetings will be bimonthlyon the last Tuesday of January (28th), March/AGM (31st), May (26th), July (28th) and Sept (29th). The Christmas Banquet will be in Nov or Dec depending on venue availability

• Craig also advised that the first edition of the new style/format Newsletter is now planned for release at the end of October.

Update: There will be a combination November /December News issue with the new style format for the newsletter in January 2020 and be published quarterly

WCRA Meeting Notes from September Meeting

WCRA is participating in a special excursion to ride the last run of the Canadian from the CPR station on Cordova Street. We will ride the Canadian to Mission on Saturday Oct. 27th with return to Vancouver by chartered bus. Departure is at 16:00 hours with arrival in Mission at 17:10 and depart by return bus at 17:30. The trip is being co-sponsored by us, Transport 2000 and the CRHA. Fares are \$7.50 for adults and reduced fares for kids. Contact Andy Preddy at 943-9423 to reserve your seat(s).

The cab of locomotive #16 has been boarded up to prevent any further deterioration. Also storage track with suitable connections has been located and the executive is following up on this lead.

Meeting was held with BC Hydro Rail officials on Sept. 27th re: the possibility of an excursion up their Valley Line next spring. Initial response has been encouraging with further details to be ironed out.

CN

The 24,000 ton Japanese freighter ' Japan Erica' struck CN' s Second Narrows bridge crossing at Burrard Inlet at 19:58 hours on Oct. 13th, severing the access to rail traffic on the North Shore. The freighter missed the lift span and instead nosed into the span immediately

north of it, knocking it into the water. In addition, the north tower of the lift section was knocked out of alignment and damaged. Preliminary estimates have the repairs taking 3 to 4 months to complete

BC Hydro

#942 (their GE 70 toner) sent to Carrall to replace SW 900 #901 which had an electrical fire on Feb. 12th. #942 received new paint last year.

BCR

Ex LS & L RS-3 #559 involved in a wreck on Jan. 15th out of Prince George is probably a write off.

CN

The GP-38-2/HBU4 set #213/278/277/215 that tested here in January have been returned to Edmonton' s Calder Yard. Comments heard that the set was not well suited for transfer work as they didn' t have enough horsepower on the heavy grade WB out of New Westminster and the train would stall with a heavy train of 100 cars. The usual set of three SD-40-2' s was much preferred. The usual run was from Thornton Yard to NV' s Lynn Yard but sometimes the four unit set was split up and one set would run into Vancouver.

GP9 #4151 & GP-38-2 #5992 that were involved in the Skeena River wreck are stored unserviceable and are likely retirement candidates

VIA

In addition to units on order or contemplated, they will rebuild the 2 E8A' s with 12-567BC engines and rated at 2500 HP. Also to be upgraded are CN' s FP7' s to FP9 rating. #' s in the program are #1402,1403, 1416, 1423 & 1432.

MLW

Montreal Locomotive Works will be discontinued in name and replaced by Bombardier. They are booked solid for 1979. The first of 2 Amtrak LRC's should be delivered shortly and will initially be used out of Washington D.C. until the fall when the matched coaches are ready for delivery. The VIA Rail LRC's will be known as model LRC-2 (M437) and are due for late 79 through mid 1980. And similar models will be delivered four off shore countries plus 10 M420's for CN.

COLLECTION

BCER 960 Report

Over the past number of months we made great progress on 960. In part we were motivated knowing the HRA delegates were going to be looking us over in September, but also, it just happened that a few critical aspects were just needing a push to be finished up.

1...The new t&g cab flooring is installed, stained and has multi layers of semi gloss hard coat.

2...Finally, there's no mistaking 960 for anything but an electric steeple cab freight engine, as her two vital trolley poles, with respective hardware, are installed on a new wooden rack, with this full assembly, now secured up on the cab roof.

A historical note ... when Bill and I, many moons back, hoisted the old rack and bits off the cab, we discovered the rack through cab roof fasteners were corroded and missing backing nuts. Gravity was indeed playing an important part in keeping 960 together in her last operational days back in 1970.

3...The two heavy cab seats were re-upholstered and all their respective mounting fittings reworked. We are keeping them out of the way till later.

4...Rear truck assembly was started (this took a lot of gear up off the shop floor before the HRA walk around), and just this past week, the traction motors plus truck frame received their last coat of paint.. We should have rear truck rebuild pretty much completed by month end October.

5...Both front and rear partially mangled stanchions and railings are all repaired... so we (ok, those other guys) have little excuse for falling off now.

6...We are cleaning up and repainting the 4 large heavy duty screens that enclosed the in cab Westinghouse high voltage electrical switching components.

7... Lots of misc work underway on components in the shop and home, that require cleanup, repair and painting.

For the HRA folks, we had both interurban headlights operating, the polished brass horn and two different whistles mounted. Refurbished ALCO GE builders plates were in place. One of the said plates was a 960 original, recovered for us, by Don Evans .

"She looked grand, even without trucks", said one observer.

Hope to have some completed rear truck pictures next go round, and please, please, give some warming thoughts out to Bob, Bill and myself these coming winter months, as we toil away in an ever cooling MP2.

I joined West Coast Railway Association two years ago. Over that period, we have improved systems, processes and controls to ensure WCRA operates efficiently as possible. We've developed a strong relationship and managed to negotiate favorable terms with our vendors and suppliers. In addition, we have been reviewing costs and making efficiencies where possible, which has resulted in new exhibits and projects around the park. It goes without saying that these exhibits and projects would not be possible without our loyal and valued volunteers. I personally want to thank each and every one of the volunteers for all their contributions, it is truly appreciated. As we continue to make improvements and efficiencies at every level (this newsletter is just one example), you will hear about them in future newsletters and at volunteer appreciation events; and see improvements at the park.

On that note, as a part of our compliance as a Registered Charity, we must ensure all donations whether cash or in-kind are documented and recorded in a timely and accurate manner. Therefore , please note the following -

Volunteer Hours and Mileage Claims

To ensure we meet the CRA requirements and timelines we have to make some changes on how these are managed.

• Claims period will run from October 1 to September 30, for 2019 it will be a short period for January 2019 to September 2019.

• Claim forms must be filled out and signed.

• The claim form can be accessed on the website (to be added) for printing or come to the park and collect a printed copy

• The claim form along with a mileage log and supporting receipts must be received by WCRA by November 7th each year.

• WCRA will issue payment for the claims in November

• For those who have kindly donated their expenses back to WCRA, you will receive a tax receipt for the expense amount excluding taxes once we receive the cheque.

Donations of Gifts other than money are accepted; however, these require prior approval: please contact donations@wcra.org.

Receipts are issued twice a year, once in July/August covering January to June and in January/ February for July to December donations. However, donations made on Gifttool are receipted immediately.




